For Immediate Release, November 3, 2011 Chamber Music Amici: First All-Baroque Concert

Chamber Music Amici presents its first all-Baroque program Monday, November 21, at 7:30 pm in the Wildish Theater in Springfield.

This program features Bach's Trio Sonata from "The Musical Offering," performed by guest violinist Kathryn Lucktenberg; guest flutist Jonas Pologe; Amici cellist Steven Pologe, cello; and guest harpsichordist Julia Brown. Also on the program will be Leclair's duo #5 for two violins, performed by Amici violinists Pilar Bradshaw and Sharon Schuman, as well as Telemann's Sonata #88 in Eb for two violins, cello, and harpsichord, performed by Schuman, Bradshaw, Pologe, and Brown. Guest soprano Laura Decher Wayte will open the program with Rameau's "L'Impatience," a cantata for voice, harpsichord and cello.

To perform these works, the string players will be using Baroque bows, and violinist Pilar Bradshaw will play on a violin made in 1681 by Andrea Guarneri, who, along with Antonio Stradivari, was an apprentice of Nicolo Amati, in Cremona, the birthplace of the violin. Guarneri produced violins known for their highly arched bodies and sweet tone, and covered them with a varnish which was composed partially of ground glass.

This concert will be repeated Saturday November 26, 7:00 pm, at Marsh Anne Landing Winery in Oakland, Oregon, with tickets available at 541-459-7998. Community outreach will include a free pre-concert concert at 3:00 pm, Saturday, November 19, as part of the Lacy Cascade Concert Series at Cascade Manor in Eugene, and three free concerts on Monday, November 14, at Page Elementary School in Springfield, to help foster the development of a new generation of chamber music lovers.

The Wildish Theater concert on November 21 will be one hour long with no intermission, followed by a party on stage. Tickets are \$20-\$25, or \$5 for students with vouchers, at 541-953-9204
